# FRIDAY BROWN

Friday Brown is twenty-five, quiet, attractive, with a fascinating voice. She has sung professionally for six years. She still lives at home, which is just outside Manchester, with her family. Her Dad is a headmaster nearby.

Friday first formed her own band, called "Wynder K Frog", which eventually disbanded – previously Friday had attended Art School for two years, before deciding that she was destined for a career in music.

She has enjoyed much success through a consistency to win Song Festivals, especially abroad. Firstly, there was the Knokke Song Festival, where she collected the Press Prize (only individual prize of the concert) in 1968. In 1970 she won the Polish Song Festival – in fact the first western performer ever to do so. In 1971 she won the Bulgarian Song Festival – and yet also failed miserably in the Yugoslavian Song Festival.

She tells me that she played the piano before speaking – "I used to crawl up to the keyboard". She confesses to being a Jack-of-all-Trades, dabbles in several musical instruments but is really master of guitar. She has worked extensively for the BBC as well as numerous appearances on TV shows; Val Doonican and The Golden Shot, to name a few.
