

Something extra on the fringe

A DDED interest to Aberdeen Arts Centre Festival Week is being provided by several fringe attractions.

Tonight the Byre Theatre Company give their third and last performance of "Two for the Seeraw."

During the second performance a group gave poetry readings in one of the smaller halls. They were arranged by Mrs Annie Inglis of Aberdeen College of Education.

Throughout the week, demonstrations and exhibitions are being held. They include exhibitions of the paintings of Moira Frewin and Ian Munro, photographs and film posters, an open rehearsal by the University Chamber Orchestra, and demonstrations of hand-loom weaving and recorder playing.

The Byre Theatre Company's visit to the city to participate in the festival is one of the innovations this year. Another is a special season of the newly formed Aberdeen Arts Centre Film Club.

Each evening, after the main performance, films are being presented in the arts centre. Each in its own way is a "landmark" in film entertainment.

Other events to take place are "electronic sounds in contemporary music" which will be presented on Thursday night by

Mr Desmond Briscoe of the BBC Radiophonic Workshop.

On Friday night there will be a recital by the celebrated baritone, John Carol Case, who will be accompanied by Mr Donald Hawksworth, music master of Aberdeen Grammar School. On Saturday night the local Morven Singers, under their conductor Alex. Elrick will contribute Scottish folk songs, part songs and madrigals.
